## **February 9–15** Walk Worthy In My Family & Marriage | Sacrificial Love

**Icebreaker:** Has there ever been a time in which someone sacrificed something for your benefit? What was the loss on their part, and what was gained on your part? How did that make you feel?

In this session, we will consider that Jesus made the ultimate sacrifice for his church so that the church would demonstrate his holiness.

## Read Ephesians 5:25-27

- In verse 25, husbands are called to love their wives as Christ loved the church.
  - In Greco-Roman society, wives had obligations to their husbands but not husbands to wives. How is this passage a revolutionary idea? How is it revolutionary even today and around the world?
  - To what extent did Christ love the church? (See also Ephesians 5:2, John 10:11–18)
  - What does this mean for husbands?
- What does it mean for Jesus to sanctify the church? (See also Hebrews 10:14)
  - Why is the Word necessary in this process? (See also Titus 3:5, John 15:3)
- What is Christ's ultimate purpose in sanctifying the church?
  - Note that though human brides prepare themselves for their husbands, Christ prepares His own bride for Himself. Why is this significant?
  - How is the preparation and presentation of the church different from how an earthly bride is presented to her husband?
  - Why is purity and holiness important in the church?
  - What happens when the church is not demonstrating holiness? (See also 2 Corinthians 11:2–4)

## Application

- Wives are called to submit to their husbands. Husbands are called to love their wives.
  - Why are both difficult? Why are both necessary?
  - What happens when either is missing?
- Why is sacrificing ourselves for the sake of another so hard?
  - Why can sacrifice within the marriage relationship be particularly difficult?
- What does unconditional sacrifice look like in our lives—sacrificing and not expecting to receive something in return?
- How does what God has done for you allow you to sacrifice this way? Consider everything we have learned so far in Ephesians—God adopting us and forgiving us, Jesus powerfully working in our lives, access to power through the Spirit.
